## Fundación Runnymede College

Two years ago Mr Powell set up a Foundación to fund the provision of first class, British Further Education to pupils from Spanish state schools with outstanding academic records

After a selection process with several candidates, this first scholarship was obtained by María due to her excellent curriculum and personal and academic potential. As a school this year our chosen charity is Fundación Runnymede College. As a community we are committed to raising funds for this incredibly important cause.

Recently Mr Powell was honoured with an award by the Ayuntamiento de Alcobendas in recognition of his outstanding contribution to Values, Excellence, and Innovation in Education through Fundación Runnymede College. We are extremely proud of Mr Powell's achievement and to be part of the Fundación's journey.



## British Ambassador to Spain -



Runnymede College was honoured to welcome the British Ambassador to Spain, Sir Alex Ellis, to campus in November. Greeted by Mr Powell, the ambassador was given a tour led by our Head Pupils. His visit included a look at Phonics sessions in the Pre-Prep, a Year 5 Science class, and Drama workshops in our new Prep School. He also observed a rehearsal of The Sound of Music, visited the Senior School's Science labs and Art Department, and concluded with a stop at the Julia Powell Sports Hall and the Frank Murphy Memorial Library. We are grateful for the ambassador's visit and the chance to showcase our vibrant school community.



## Valencia Collection

In November, Runnymede students and staff organised a collection for the victims of the DANA in Valencia, which devastated the southern area of the city. Runnymede College's donations were so substantial that they filled not only a truck but also two additional four-by-fours.

The supplies, furniture, and IT equipment were successfully delivered to Colegio San Blas, one of the schools hit by the floods. Carles, a local teacher, expressed deep gratitude, explaining that their entire stock of materials and furniture had been damaged. Thanks to our collective effort, their school is closer to resuming lessons.

Our sixth-form volunteer team did an outstanding job organising, packing, and labelling the donations, which allowed for efficient delivery to other affected schools in the region, including Escuela Infantil Be You, Escoleta Guardería Infantil Xicalla, Colegio San Carlos, Colegio San Blas, and CEI Garabatos.



A popular part of the Pre-Prep Winter calendar is the school trip to Xanadu indoor ski centre, kindly organised by the PE teaching staff. This is a great chance for children to get learning outside the classroom and- in many cases- show their teachers a thing or two about skiing!







Reception went to Monjarama Pumpkin Farm to pick their own pumpkins to spark their learning around pumpkins which included making delicious pumpkin soup!

They visited a local forest to develop their Forest School provision.

Children particularly enjoyed crossing a small stream using a log bridge and creating artwork inspired by the artist Andy Goldsworthy.







#### Year 3 Trip to Parque Archaeologico

This term, Year 3 enjoyed an amazing trip to Arqueopinto. During the visit, we explored how Homo sapiens evolved across the Stone Age, Bronze Age, and Iron Age. We learned about how they hunted, their fire-making techniques, and the transition from being nomadic hunter-gatherers to living in organised communities.






