



His visit included a look at Phonics sessions in the Pre-Prep, a Year 5 Science class, and Drama workshops in our new Prep School. He also observed a rehearsal of The Sound of Music, visited the Senior School's Science labs and Art Department, and concluded with a stop at the Julia Powell Sports Hall and the Frank Murphy Memorial Library. Valencia Collection

In November, Runnymede students and staff organised a collection for the victims of the DANA in Valencia, which devastated the southern area of the city. Runnymede College's donations were so substantial that they filled not only a truck but also two additional four-by-fours.

The supplies, furniture, and IT equipment were successfully delivered to Colegio San Blas, one of the schools hit by the floods. Carles, a local teacher, expressed deep gratitude, explaining that their entire stock of materials and furniture had been damaged. Thanks to our collective effort, their school is closer to resuming lessons.

Our sixth-form volunteer team did an outstanding job organising, packing, and labelling the donations, which allowed for efficient delivery to other affected schools in the region, including Escuela Infantil Be You, Escoleta Guardería Infantil Xicalla, Colegio San Carlos, Colegio San Blas, and CEI Garabatos.

Reclaiming Narratives



On Thursday 7th November, all the Year 13 Spanish students enjoyed a day out in the centre of Madrid learning about Federico García Lorca's works and life in Madrid. These pupils are studying La Casa de Bernarda Alba, written by the worldwide known author born in Granada so expanding their knowledge about his figure was a very valuable tool in preparation for the A level exams they will sit in June 2025. We walked along the streets in the central areas of Madrid: Puerta del Sol, Plaza Mayor and Plaza de Santa Ana, before visiting the Residencia de Estudiantes in Calle del Pinar where Lorca lived during his years in the capital of Spain. The students thoroughly enjoyed the experience.


Sporting Events —

draft resolutions and negotiate compromises. The MUN conference not only enhanced students' understanding of global politics but also fostered a sense of responsibility and global citizenship.

Year 13 Valencia Trip

In September, we took Year 13 geographers on an enriching trip to Valencia, where they engaged in hands-on learning about key geographical issues. At the Oceanogràfic, they explored the complex relationships between sustainability, tourism, and conservation. A visit to L'Albufera included a boat trip offering close encounters with local biodiversity-highlighted by a fish jumping into the boat-and a tour of rice fields, where students learned about traditional agriculture and its impact on water security. On the final day, we explored the El Cabanyal neighborhood, examining gentrification and the conflicts between locals and tourists, particularly the effects of Airbnbs. Throughout the trip, students practiced valuable techniques for their independent investigations and refined their proposals for their coursework. This immersive experience made our charity collection following the devastating DANA storms even more meaningful, as students had seen firsthand the importance of protecting these vulnerable environments, having recently visited the effected areas.

Year 11 and 12 Borneo Trip

Borneo, one of the most beautiful islands in the world, will be a once in a lifetime experience. The trip dates are planned to departure between the 22nd – 23rd June 2025 and the duration will be 15 days including travel. We are travelling with the same company students travelled to Nepal with in June 2024, Global Action, if you would like to see more, the video from Nepal 2024 is available on the school website.

The purpose of the trip is centred around global learning, encompassing cultural exposure, volunteering and expanding citizenship. Borneo will be an incredible experience. Beginning in Sabah, we will enjoy spectacular views of Mount Kinabalu, and explore the tropical Borneo Rainforest, an area of vital importance to many endemic species. Alongside an environmental charity, students will enjoy a unique community project, as well as participate in important projects to reforest the wildlife corridor. We will enjoy learning about Jungle Survival, before embarking on an exciting trek into protected rainforests. We will see conservation efforts first-hand: visiting the inspirational Sepilok Orangutan Rehabilitation Centre, and Bornean Sun Bear Conservation Centre. We finish this special trip by exploring a beautiful tropical island, in the Tunku Abdul Rahman National Park.
